## Government Crop Report

Below is given the figures from the latest government report of estimates that may be interesting reading for many of our subscribers. It is interesting to note that these figures put our country on a very firm basis financially and should arouse all farmers to the last ounce of energy that is necessary to make the most of what they have.

Washington, D. C. October 7, 1915. Estimates of crop production and prices for the State of Oregon and for the United States compiled by the Bureau of Crop Estimates (and transmitted through the Weather Bureau.) U. S. Department of Agriculture, are as follows:

### WHEAT

State: Estimate this year, 17,400,000 bu., final estimate last year 16,604,000; price October 1 to producers 76 cts., year ago 93 cts.

United States: Estimate this year 1,000,000,000 bu., final estimate last year 891,000,000; October 1 price 90.9 cts., year ago 93.5 cts.

### OATS

State: Production estimate October 1 is 15,500,000 bu., September 1 forecast 14,159,000, final estimate last year 12,740,900; price October 1 to producers 35 cts., year ago 42 cts.

United States: Production estimate October 1 is 1,520,000,000 bu., September 1 forecast 1,408,000,000, final estimate last year 1,141,000,000; October 1 price 34.5 cts., year ago 43.3 cts.

### BARLEY

State: Production estimate October 1 is 4,790,000 bu., September 1 forecast 4,309,000, final estimate last year 3,660,000; price October 1 to producers 50 cts., year ago 57 cts.

United States: Production estimate October 1 is 237,000,000 bu., September 1 forecast 222,936,000, final estimate last year 194,953,000; October 1 price 46.8 cts., year ago 51.8 cts.

### POTATOES

State: October 1 forecast 6,610,000 bu., September 1 forecast 6,688,000 final estimate last year 4,753,000; price October 1 to producers 46 cts., year ago 64.7 cts.

United States: October 1 forecast 368,000,000 bu., September 1 forecast 405,909,000, final estimate last year 405,921,000; October 1 price 48.7 cts., year ago 64.7 cts.

### APPLES

State: October 1 forecast 1,060,000 bbls., September 1 forecast 1,134,000 bbls., final estimate last year 1,200,000 bbls.; price September 15 to producers \$2.55 per bbl., year ago \$2.28

United States: October 1 forecast 71,600,000 bbls., September 1 forecast 71,199,000 bbls., final estimate last year 84,400,000 bbls.; price September 15 to producers \$1.74 per bbl., year ago \$1.85.

We heard of an instance this week that was related to us about a man who had a lot of fine grain hay that he was not wishing to thresh out, preferring instead to buy the grain and sell his hay later. He went to town and secured prices at the market quotations and nearly threw a fit because the price as he declared was nearly out of sight. He forgot for a moment that he was a farmer that liked to get the highest price he could for his products. Anyway he did not buy then, but roamed the county until he found a farmer who was not well posted on the market prices and secured from him a very fine quality of grain, better than he had expected and paid not a premium as you might expect, but a third less than the market quoted and then not satisfied with his bargain stipulated that the man must deliver it to the buyers ranch some miles away. Within a few days he was approached by a buyer for his grain, that was still there and he quoted a price that was much over the price of the grain that he had secured a few days before and for fear that he might have made a mistake he stipulated that the buyer must call and get the hay. Now we cannot say that this is true but supposing it was, was that the proper spirit for the farmer to extend to his brother farmer? Some will say that it was business, but was it? Down, deep in your heart you will say, No! and you will be right. Such spirit is not of brotherly love.
