The purpose of street cleaning is to remove as quickly and as cheaply as possible all foreign matter in the streets and thus to conduce to the health of the public by minimizing the circulation of germ laden dust.

The cleaning of streets should be carried out in a systematic and thorough manner. The cleaners should proceed in crews with the necessary apparatus both to clean the streets and the side walks as well, if necessary, and the

Dresden adopted the practice of clean ing the main streets in the early morn ing hours, beginning about 4 a. m. and finishing the business sections by 6 a. m., some 20 to 30 per cent of the en tire street area. The cleaning of the remainder of the streets proceeds immediately after the main streets are finished, and the whole city is cleaned

by 9 a, m. Only streets in outlying districts are cleaned later in the day. often in the afternoon, but all streets must be cleaned once a day, whether there is much dirt or little on them. The practice of Dresden has been tol. owed by practically all prominent Gernan cities.
