

COLOSSAL STATUARY FOR PANAMA-PACIFIC EXPOSITION.

TERIOR of one of three studies at the Panama-Pacific International Exposition to open in San Francisco next year, showing the partially completed figures, some of them thirty feet in height, which will adorn the vast courts.

The garden and landscape effects are almost completed at this writing, over a million rare trees, flowering shrubs and plants being used.

This greatest of universal expositions already gives proof that it will present the masterpieces of the world of art and that in its harmonious beauty its high educational value and utility it will be unsurpassed in history.
