Forrest Supervisor Cryder announces that beginning about February 1 the District Forecaster, U. S. Weather Bureau, Portland, Oregon, will begin sending the special weather forecasts for the benefit of stockmen. This is the resumption of the service maintained last winter and spring which proved so valuable to the stockmen. The forecasts will be telegraphed to the Forest Supervisor and by him telegraphed or telephoned to the various distributing centers for immediate distribution. Distributing centers are established at Heppner, Pendleton, Pilot Rock, Arlington and Condon, so that all sections of the tributary stock raising country will be served. The names of the gentlemen who have kindly consented to distribute these forecasts follow: Mr. J. O. Hager, Secretary Oregon Wood Growers Association, Heppner, Oregon; Mr. L. C. Scharpf, First Bank of Pilot Rock, Pilot Rock, Ore.; Mr. George Smith, Arlington, Oregon; Mr. O. B. Robertson, Cashier First National Bank, Condon, Oregon. The forecasts will be placed without cost in the hands of the above gentlemen, but those stockmen desiring to receive the forecasts must arrange to meet the expense of delivery should there be any.

Here I stand; I cannot do otherwise; God Help Me; Amen! I cannot submit my faith either to the pope or to councils. They have frequently erred and contradicted each other. Unless I am convinced by the testimony of the Scripture, and unless my conscience is satisfied by the Word of God, I cannot and will not retract. For it is dangerous for a Christian to speak against his conscience. Here I stand, I can do naught else. God Help Me. Amen!" Yours for liberty of conscience and the authority of the Scriptures.
