We know withing of the basis upon which the British hids were made, but the pubhe is entitled to know the facts upon which we ourselves bid for this work.

Two years ago we took contracts to make 4,200 14-inch shells at a price of \$1,515,000. Up to new not a single shell has been ac-cepted by the Government, although we have expended, in wages, materials, etc., on these orders \$522,881, and we have not received a SINGLE DOLLAR on these contracts.

In addition, a literal interpretation of the contract might make us liable for providing amounting to \$678,915.

In the light of our experience, and hav-ing no other basis, we bid for 16-inch shells approximately the same rate per pound as that which the Navy Depart-ment actually awarded a 14 inch shell contract one year ago.
