BOARDMAN

That the O-W. R. & N. Company is taking a real interest in the West Extension of the Umatilla Project is shown by the fact that Farmer Smith of the Railroad Company will devote much of his time this Spring, Summer and Fall to the interests of the new farmers of the Project. He will conduct a demonstration of growing corn and vegetables on the townsite of Boardman. He will also supply the farmers with seed corn, and show them how to build silos and supply a man to till them properly. In fact, in every way possible he will aid the farmer to produce more tonnage for the railway company, and thereby help the farmer to raise more crops and get more money for what he produces. The Company has adopted the policy of developing the territory along its lines.

H. Boardman, the original settler of Boardman and all the country around, who located the land which is the townsite, also has an island in the Columbia River, just across the main channel from the town. He is improving part of the tillable land and will plant a cherry orchard hereon. He has built a small house on the island and J. A. [unclear] is employed clearing the [unclear]. Mr. Boardman says that his island will be the Coney of the big city on the Columbia and tourists from the world over, traveling the Columbia Highway will stop there for a breathing spell and to enjoy the sports of his ideal spot.

Paul Jones, the irrigation engineer was down this week to help Mr. Mitchell start his irrigation system correctly. Mr. Jones is employed by the government to direct the new settlers as to the best methods of irrigating their lands and no charge made for his work. He takes an instrument into the field and lays off the irrigating system and describes the best methods of dealing with each tract of land. He has been of great assistance around Hermiston and is now extending his services to the West Extension. Any farmer desiring his assistance should arrange a date in advance. Dr. M. S. Kern of Pendleton is leveling his sixty acres of land in Irigon leveled and seeded to alfalfa. He owns part of the little homestead which he purchased last fall. It lies about three miles southwest of Irigon and is fine land. He expects to get a good crop this year and his land is in the vicinity where he can readily dispose of his hay to sheepmen for winter feeding. In the same locality two other places will be improved adjoining. Dr. Kern is a booster for the irrigated country.

Boardman is to have a baseball team. There is sufficient timber for a good team and fortunately there are already a number of 13 players in town and near by. The players are practicing and will organize the team soon. It is thought they will arrange a number of games with the other teams in the county and district. The already training are as follows: Carl Voren, Bob Crooks, Phelps, J. O. Lower, J. C. [unclear], Sidney Mack, S. H. [unclear], W. A. Price and the Partlow brothers.
