1. In no case should the flag be permitted to touch the ground, nor should it be marred by advertise-ments, nor desecrated on the stage,

For indoor decorations the flag can only be used as a drapery: it cannot be used to cover a bench or table, or where anything can be placed upon the flag.

3. No words, figures, pictures or marks of any kind should be placed

When our national flag and state or other flags fly together, or are used in decoration, our national flag should be on the right.

Whenever possible the flag should always be allowed to fly in the breeze from a staff or mast, but if it should be necessary to fasten it to the side of a building or platform, it should hang with the blue field at the upper left hand corner.
