All former champions will meet and compete for the supreme title. In the cowgirls relay race Ruth Parton, Mabel DeLong, Bertha Blancett, Mrs. Parsons, Leta Smith and Josephine Sherry will ride against each other. In the cowboys' relay Sleepy Armstrong, Darrell Cannon, Allen Drumheller, Paxton Irwin, Knapp Lynch and Bob Anderson will ride. These riders are all champions. In the steer roping Geo. Wier, Charlie Wier, Joe Beason, Henry Yabeny, Sammy Garrett, Tom Grimes, Ed McCarty, Dan Clark and John Judd, all former winners, will compete. In every other one of the competitive events it will be the same thing, champion against champion and then some outsiders. The Directors say it will be the biggest Round Up ever pulled off. These people will all positively be here, as the Round-Up never makes such an announcement until it is a sure thing. Indications are that the crowd will be up to normal. The seat sale opens Sept. 1, and the advance sale is already above 1915.
