L. K. Harlan Passes

Within the past ten years Mr. Harlan published newspapers in many towns in Gilliam, Morrow and Umatilla counties where he enjoyed a wide acquaintance. He was for some time connected with the Condon Globe, leaving that paper to establish the Ione Bulletin, later moving his plant to Heppner where he established the Herald. Leaving Heppner he established the Pilot Rock Record and while there he also published, for longer or shorter periods, newspapers in a number of the smaller towns in Umatilla county. A few weeks ago he severed his connection with the Pilot Rock paper and went to LaGrande where he expected to identify himself with the Observer, in that city. Soon after reaching LaGrande, however, he was attacked by the fatal illness from which he failed to rally. While a resident of Condon Mr. Harlan was married to Miss Florence Clarke, a most estimable young lady of that city, who with three young children survives him. To them will go forth the tenderest sympathy of a host of friends. The remains were taken to Condon for interment funeral services being held in that city Friday, November 20th.
