F. J. Darlington, deputy collector U. S. revenue, was in town yesterday on business connected with the Portland custom house.

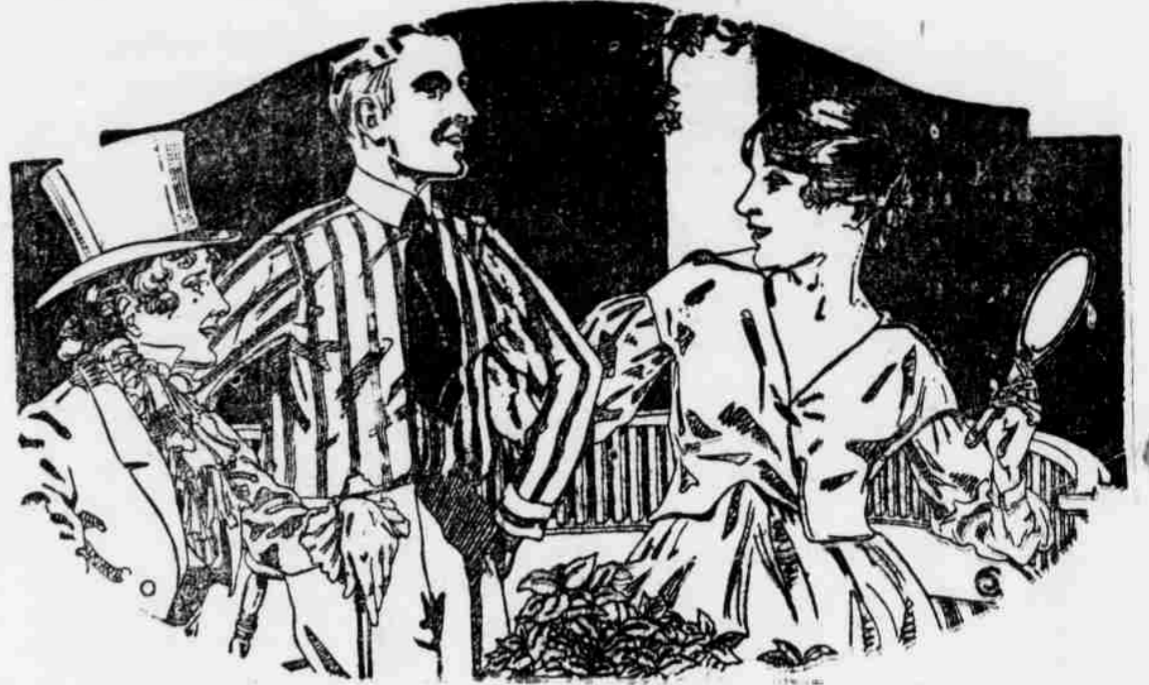
A big delegation of Elks came over from Condon yesterday to attend lodge here last evening, bringing with them seven candidates for initiation from Gilliam and Wheeler counties.
