WAR A GREAT LEVELER

The arrest, trial, conviction and sentence of a young man in Syracuse, N. Y., for idling in war time, has peculiar interest as marking the first pronounced and clear-cut case of the kind under the anti loafing law in the State named.

The budget for the ensuing year was read, considered and adopted. The estimated cost of maintaining the school for the ensuing year is \$20,000. Of this amount the item of teachers' salaries is the largest, being estimated at \$12,100.
