### MOVIE INTO RED CROSS POST

A Paris dispatch just received by mail tells of a captured German movie picture house in the St. Michel sector which in two hours after the Americans got into the town was turned into an American Red Cross outpost. This theater, before the American drive, was six miles back of German lines, and at the time the dispatch was written was three miles behind the American front lines.

The theater was taken after two hours hard fighting in which the hours hard fighting in which the place was riddled with machine gun bullets. One hundred and fifty German prisoners were captured when the Germans finally hoisted the white flag. An entire motion picture outfit, including projector, films, piano and screen, were taken. In the projector the Americans found a German comedy reel ready to be shown.

The American Red Cross supply truck when it reached the town was sent to the theater which was turned over bodily to the canteen work. Within a few minutes five hundred men were in line being served by three Red Cross workers with hot chocolate, cigarettes, tobacco, eating chocolate, toilet articles, blankets and underwear.

The captured piano was kept going all day long by musical soldiers. The reading and writing room immediately established was crowded all day long, four hundred soldiers taking their first chance to write home since the start of the drive.

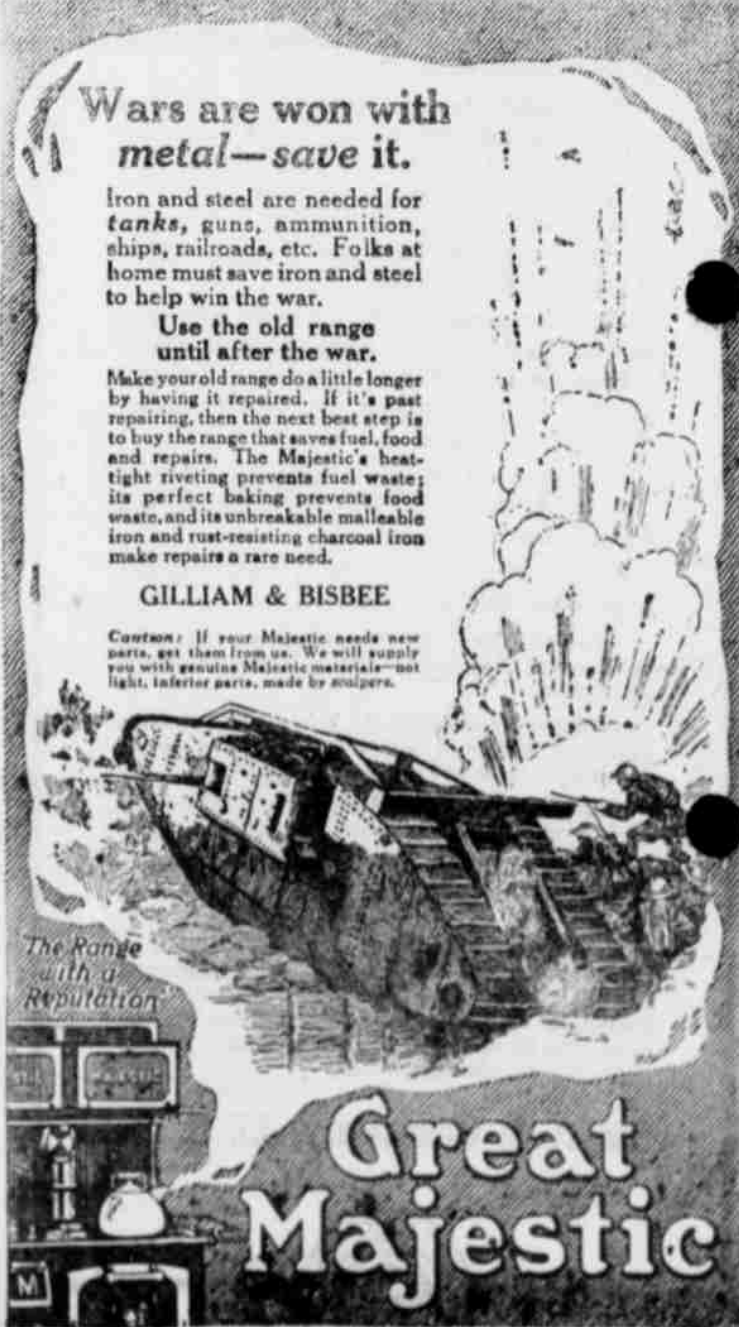
