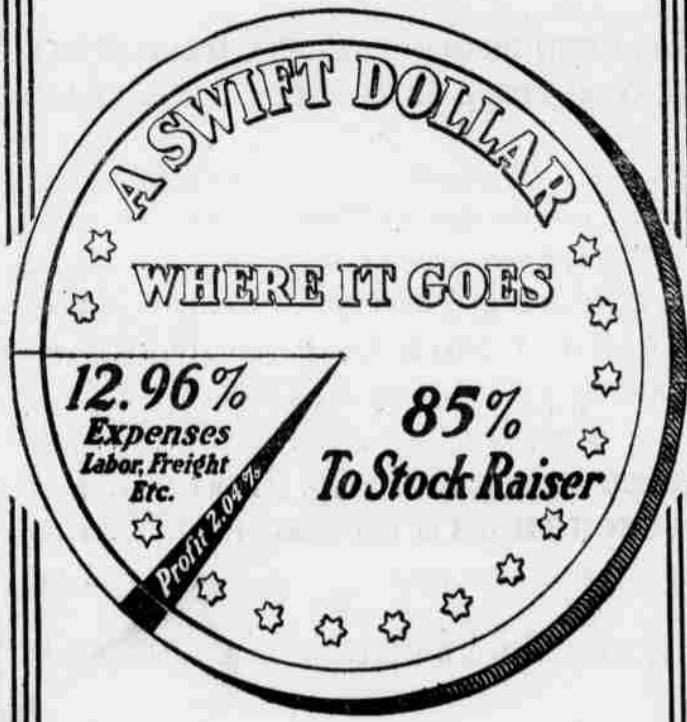


The Swift Dollar for 1918

Hon. Milton A. Miller, Collector of Internal Revenue, Portland, Oregon, under date of January 17, 1919, makes the following statement in regard to the new Income Tax Law:

The basic principles of the old law will probably apply to the provisions of the new law, so far as income tax is concerned, and it would be well for each individual, partnership and corporation, to prepare their figures and ascertain the exact amount of their net income, so that the actual returns can be made with as little delay as possible.
