### COUNTY PETITIONS FOR TWO POST ROADS

The county court of Morrow county has filed resolutions with the State Highway Commission asking to have the county road leading from Heppner to the Grant county line via Hardman and Parkers Mill accepted as a post road which will entitle it to road cooperation from the state as well as from the federal government.

A similar resolution has also been filed on behalf of the proposed rural free delivery route from Heppner via Lena, Butter creek, Sand hollow, Juniper canyon and Lexington back to Heppner.

Acceptance of these roads will mean that they will be in line to receive one dollar from the state and two dollars from the federal government for every dollar expended in permanent improvements by the county.
