For Issuing Road Bonds of Morrow County, Oregon

NOTICE is hereby given that on the third day of June, 1919, a special election will be held in cinct, County of Morrow, State of Oregon, and throughout said County, to determine whether the County Court shall issue bonds of said County to provide for permanent road construction to the amount of Two Hundred Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$290,000.00) to mature in ten years, not more than \$290,000.00 to be issued in any one year, and to bear interest at the rate of five and one-half per cent per annum; and the funds so raised shall be expended in building permanent roads, described as follows, to-wit:

ONE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$125,000.00), shall be expended on the road known as the Willow Creek section of the Oregon-Washington Highway, otherwise known as the Willow Creek road, and running from the Morrow-Gilliam County line to Heppner,

The beginning or initial point being the intersection of the Morrow-Gilliam County line and the survey of the center line of the Oregon-Washington Highway, Willow Creek section, which point is South o° 22' West 2246 feet from the Northwest corner of Section Six (6), Township Two (2), North Range Twenty-three (23), E. W.
