"I heartily applaud World Trade Club's activities in favor of legislation providing for exclusive legality within the United States of America of decimal metric system of weights and measures," he wires. "Any legislation enacted would of course take due care of commercial interests during reasonable period of transition; and consequently alarm because of the change is wholly groundless. A very great stimulus indeed would be effected by our accepting the metric standards of industry, education and science in use throughout the world, whose prosperity and efficient service to so great an extent now squarely depend upon our pro-
