First District—Counties: Benton, Clackamas, Clatsop, Columbia, Coos, Curry, Douglas, Jackson, Josephine, Lane, Lincoln, Linn, Marion, Polk, Tillamook, Washington and Yamhill, (17 counties). Population, 1910, 303,624.

Second District—Counties: Baker, Crook, Deschutes, Gilliam, Grant, Harney, Hood River, Klamath, Lake, Malheur, Morrow, Sherman, Umatilla, Union, Wallowa, Wasco and Wheeler. (18 counties). Population, 1910, 142,870.

Third District—Counties: Multnomah. Population, 1910, 226,261.

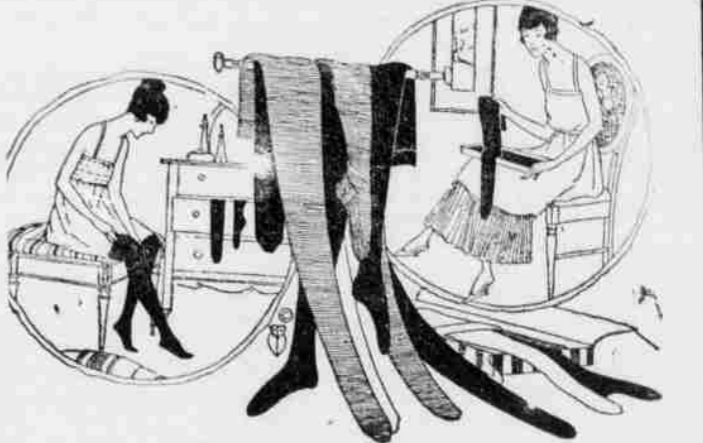
