In some continental churches notices may be seen requesting women to keep on their hats.

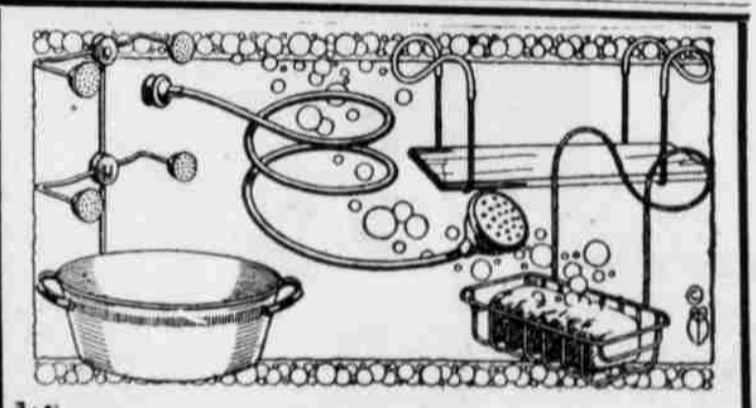
The postmen in Portugal save themselves much walking on Sundays by delivering letters at church.
