**LONG AND SHORT HAUL LEGISLATION RECEIVES FAVORABLE CONSIDERATION**

The following letter has been addressed to Senator A. B. Cummins, of Iowa, by H. H. Corey, of the Public Service Commission of Oregon, regarding the long-and-short-haul legislation now under consideration in congress. Senator Cummins is chairman of the sub-committee which recently made a favorable report on the measure.

"All Eastern Oregon was pleased to learn, through the press, that we were successful in securing a favorable legislation pending before congress, and that the sub-committee of which you are chairman, stood five to one in favor of the measure.

On behalf of the people of Eastern Oregon, I am writing to express our sincere appreciation of your support knowing that your able representations and conclusions in the premises is based upon a nation wide knowledge and years of experience on the railroad question which is exceedingly broad and comprehensive, and that we feel that your support of the legislation in question, based as it is upon such wide knowledge and opportunity for full investigation, is a sincere testimonial in behalf of the reasonableness and justice of the relief for which we have contended.

We appreciate the fact that large interests located in favored rate localities will endeavor to defeat the long-and-short haul measure on the floors of congress. However, we have faith in the ability of yourself and colleagues to influence a majority of the members of the senate to see the justice of our cause, so that they may finally be able to support this very meritorious relief measure."
