VOICES OF WOMEN NEEDED IN RECONSTRUCTION WORK

Henry Morgenthau, former United States ambassador to Turkey, in an address before the Connecticut Women's Suffrage convention at Bridgeport said that women were urgently needed today in world reconstruction. His topic was "The Woman Citizen and Reconstruction." Mr. Morgenthau said, in part:

"Your sex has fought 50 years for the right to vote, for the right to assist in governing, and you will come into possession of that right at a time when you will be most needed. If women will go into the government and use the qualities which made them good mothers, I haven't the least doubt but things will change. Ladies, we really need you more than you need the vote. If the limit of woman's capacity is to remain at home, and attend to children, then I am disappointed. I believe we all ought to rise above party lines, and use our energy to help the world, which needs us now as never before."

Glass Produced by Volcanoes.

Volcanoes are enormous producers of glass, derived (just as we get it) from the melting of quartz rocks. It is a right good quality of glass, too, though black as ink. In pre-Columbian days the aborigines of Mexico and Central America used it for razors and other implements. Our own Indians found it valuable for arrow-heads, immense deposits of it being found in the far West. Sulphur, which is so indispensable for a great variety of purposes, is exclusively a volcanic product. Likewise gypsum, which, in the form of plaster of paris, is a necessity to sculptors, makers of casts and many other industrial workers. Pumicestone, derived from volcanoes, is used in various arts and crafts.

Why Londoners Rise Late.

There is one point in defense of London's dislike of early rising, writes a correspondent of the London Chronicle. It is largely a matter of geography, and Greenwich time has a real business value. It enables the Londoner in his working hours to be in touch with more than half the world on the same day. When he gets down to his office in the city at 10 a. m. the business man has the afternoon prices from Bombay or even from Peking, on the one hand, and before he returns home for dinner he has learned the morning news of the American markets. The New Yorker has to rise early, for even when he opens 'change at 8 a. m. it is already afternoon in London.
