Until some political settlement can be obtained for the Near East and some government established in responsibility for the care and repatriation of the Armenian population in the Caucasus, this mass of people must live sheerly by the charity of the United States. There are in the Caucasus approximately 1,800,-000 Armenians, of whom 800,000 are entirely destitute-refugees from Turkey-and amongst them a tremendous mass of children.
