TIMBER SUPPLY IN DANGER

Expert Points Out What Seems to Him Imperative Need of a National Forest Policy.

"One of the most interesting things to come to my knowledge is the seeming lack of interest on the part of the people of the United States to save our forests," said Charles Lathrop Pack, president of the American Forestry association. "Our new growth of timber is not more than one-third of the amount being used or destroyed, every year. There is an end to all things," continued Mr. Pack, "and the timbermen, lumbermen and wood-using Industries must get together with the foresters on a national forest policy of some kind. We all know about locking the stable door after the horse is stolen, and we can all stand around and wonder what to do when the well runs dry, but what are we going to de when the forests give out? Place your finger on something into which the use of wood in the making does not enter. Rather hard for you to do it, I will say. The newspaper owner knows about the mounting cost of print paper and the cost of the barrel in which you find your flour has gone away up. You cannot eat the paper or the barrel, but they figure hig in the high cost of living you hear so much about. We must have a national forest policy in this country, and that soon,"
