HIGHER EDUCATION COSTS ARE LOWEST IN OREGON

Agricultural education in six of the United States, not counting O. A. C. which is second in point of attendance, is \$396 a year per student. Should the people of Oregon approve the millage tax bill for levying \$1.26 on each \$1000 assessed valuation for the college, university and normal school O. A. S.'s share would fall \$70 short of providing \$326 a year for its students.

Enactment of the measure will provide \$326 per student annually, as against the \$396 average.

The college is now training precisely twice the number provided for in 1915, and has one-fifteenth more more money to do it with.
