

CHAMBER OF COMMERCE OF ENTERPRISE, OREGON, APPROVES BOTH MEASURES

At the Chamber of Commerce banquet held at Enterprise last Saturday evening, March 19, at which

there were present one hundred and fifty of the leading citizens of that city, a resolution was passed unanimously favoring the millage tax in support of the elementary schools, also the measure in support of the higher educational institutions.

At the end of the summer vacation a number of these teachers will glance at the \$75-\$90 salary out there in the country school district with all the inconveniences of boarding in the country and decide to stay with her more lucrative position. This will help to cause a greater shortage of teachers.

Therefore, it behooves us to support the elementary educational bill which will provide additional funds for every public school in the state.
