Franklin D. Roosevolt is Given Second Place On Ticket.

San Francisco, James M. Cox, governor of Ohlo, was nominated for president of the United States in the demoeratic national convention at 1:40. o'clock Tuesday morning. The con- day of August, 1920, at the hour of vention then adjourned until noon ten o'clock in the forenoon of said Tuesday, to canvass the question of goeand place to complete the ticket.

When the convention convened again at noon Tuesday it was decided to give second place on the ticket to the East, Franklin D. Roosevelt of New York, assistant secretary of the navy.

The nomination of Cox came at the conclusion of a 44-ballot struggle in which he had steadily beaten down the forces of William G. McAdoo, exsecretary of the treasury, and President Wilson's son-in-law.

When the balloting on the 44th vote had reached a point where Cox had 702 votes and was rapidly approaching the necessary two-thirds of 729, Sam


