centers of the world. The Oregon State Chamber of Commerce has discussed this matter thoroughly with C. W. Hodson of Port land, Oregon's representative on the Rivers and Harborn Congress, and Mr. McLain states that it is highly necessary that immediate and drastic action be taken to improve our larbors and increase our shipping facilities if the Northwest expects to keep pace with other sections of the United States. 
