WHAT THE SALVATION ARMY IS DOING

At the Oregon Rescue and Maternity Home at the present time, there are fifty-two girls and thirty babies. Twenty-two counties in Oregon are represented by these girl mothers, many of whom are yet in their teens.
At the Working Men's hotel in Portland during the past year, one thousand six hundred thirty men have been given free beds, nine hundred thirty four were given free rooms, six hundred seventy meals were given away. In the past three months more beds and meals have been provided free of charge than during the entire period of last year. During the past winter months an average of sixty-five men have slept on the office floor in this hotel every night and were glad of the privilege.
The Industrial home, where dependent men are given employment working with waste paper, waste clothing and waste furniture, is crowded as never before in the history of the institution.
In the annual Home Service appeal which will be conducted again this year from May 1 to May 10, the Army will ask the people of Oregon for \$90,000 to be used to relieve poverty, disease, misery and despair among our home people right here in Oregon. A worthy cause.

OF INTEREST TO SHEEPHERDERS

Sheepherders will now be assured of payment for their services under the provisions of a law passed by the recent legislature, giving the herders lien priority over all other claims.
Following is the text of the new law:
Section 10250—Sheep herder May Retain Possession Until Claim is Paid—Any person rendering service as set forth in section 10259, desiring to secure the benefits of this act, shall within thirty days after the close of such care, attention or services, file with the county recorder or county clerk, as the case may be, of the county in which such animals are located, a notice of his in-

attention to claim a lien upon such animals for his care or attention or services for a time not exceeding one year in all, from the date on which such care, attention or services commenced. Such notice shall state the name of the person claiming the lien, the name or names of the owner or reputed owner of the animals sought to be charged with the lien, and a description sufficient for identification of the animals upon which the lien is claimed. Such notice of lien must be verified by the oath of the person claiming the lien, to the effect that he believes the same to be true; and when such notice of lien is filed, the lien created by this act shall have priority over all other incumbrances or liens upon such sheep, of every kind and nature whatsoever.
