



Section 10260-Sheep herder May Retain Possession Until Claim is Paid—Any person rendering service, as set forth in section 10259, de siring to secure the benefits of this act, shall within thirty days after the close of such care, attention or services, file with the county recorder or county clerk, as the case may be, of the county in which such ani-mals are located, a notice of his in-

tention to claim a lien upon such ARMY IS DOING animals for his care or attention or services for a time not exceeding one year in all, from the date on which such care, attention or serv-ices commenced. Such notice shall state the name of the person claiming the lien, the name or names of the owner or reputed owner of the animals sought to be charged with the lien, and a description sufficient for identification of the animals up on which the lien is claimed. notice of lien must be verified by he oath of the person claiming the lien, to the efect that he believes same to be true; and when such no-tice of lien is filed, the lien created by this act shall have priority over all other incumbrances or liens upon such sheep, of every kind and nature whatsoever.
