ing of one hundred, and twenty-five farmers where it was quite thoroughly discused. There seems to be no reason to question the ability to get men at this price and the reason that it was made as high as it was is investy because the boys in Sherman county are going to set that price and they felt here that it would not be advisable to place it much lower.


