HARVEST WAGE SCALE

The Morrow County farmers at their meeting of the Oregon Grain Growers took up the discussion of the wages. This was introduced by the chairman of the labor committee, Ed Bettman, and upon his motion the following wage scale was adopted:

Work for haying.....\$2.00 a day.
Harvest work, common labor such as box-drivers, straw haulers and wheat haulers..... 3.99 a day.
Loaders..... 3.50 a day
Sack sewers, header-punchers, and combine drivers.....4.99 a day
Caterpillar men.....7.00 a day
Separator tender.....8.99 a day
Cook's.....5.99 a day

This scale was adopted at a meeting of one hundred and twenty-five farmers where it was quite thoroughly discussed. There seems to be no reason to question the ability to get men at this price and the reason that it was made as high as it was is largely because the boys in Sherman county are going to set that price and they felt here that it would not be advisable to place it much lower.
