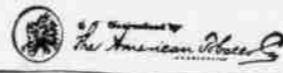

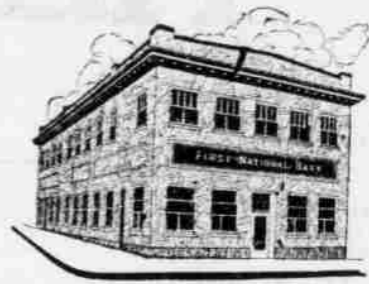
One bay gelding, about 5 years old, weight about 1000 pounds, mushroom brand on left shoulder.
