Details of How Campaign Will Close

This period, the final one of the campaign, no subscriptions will be accepted through the campaign department of the Herald, but instead, candidates themselves will deposit their final collections in a sealed ballot box, located in a local bank.

Monday the ballot box was locked and sealed, and placed in the bank, where it will remain until 8:00 o'clock Saturday night, November 18th. At that time the seals will be broken, the box unlocked, and immediately thereafter the final count will take place.

The Herald takes this opportunity to compliment the club members in the prize and auto campaign for the excellent work done, to date. Hundreds of new subscriptions have been added to the Herald's list, and these subscriptions are a big asset, not only to the paper but to the community as well.

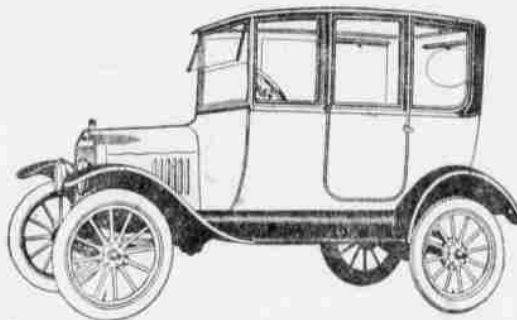
