N. J. SINNOTT FILES FOR RE-ELECTION

Salem, Ore., April 1.—N. J. Sinnott, representative in congress from the second Oregon district, Monday filed with the secretary of state his declaration by the Republican party. His home is at The Dalles. "Chairman public lands committee, ranking member irrigation committee, member House steering committee," is his slogan. Sinnott's platform says: "If nominated and elected, I will, during my term of office, advocate and support safeguarding the fruits of the toil of the farmer and stockman and the exchange value of his products by prompt enactment of the McNary-Haugen bill and kindred legislation for agricultural relief; effective and thorough selection and restriction of immigration as embodied in the Johnson immigration bill; President Coolidge's recommendation for a separate department

and a place in the cabinet for education; child labor amendment; protection and utilization of national forests with reasonable grazing fees; adjusted compensation for former ex-service men; development of our water powers; additional reclamation projects; immediate and permanent tax reduction." R. J. Kirkwood of Portland filed Monday as a candidate for the Republican nomination for representative in the legislature from Multnomah county. "Efficient, courageous and conscientious public service" is his slogan.

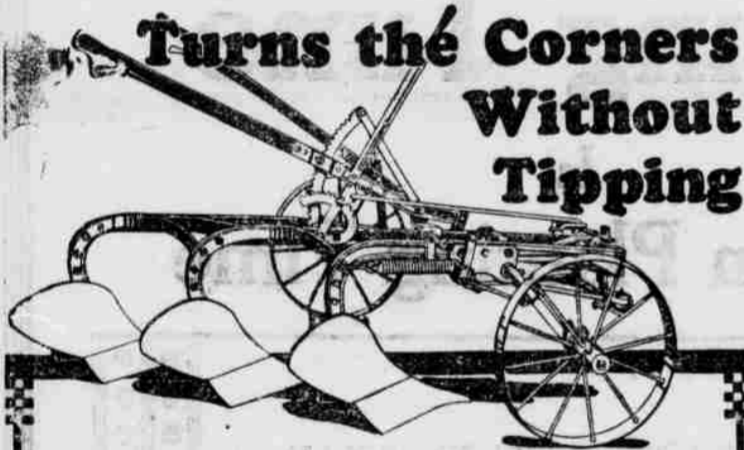
