Rev. Robinson preached here last Wednesday evening. Rev. Robinson is only a student minister but a very agreeable talker.

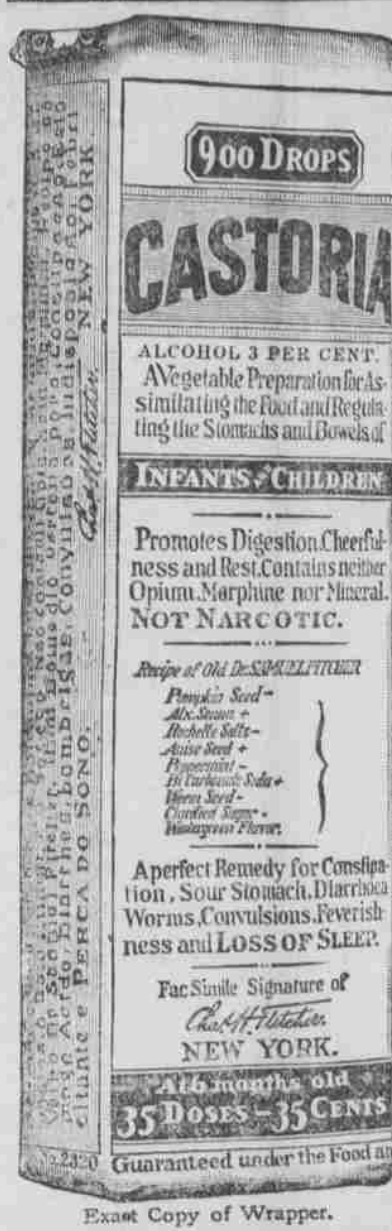
