It would seem that about all that was necessary to be said, was spoken in our last issue concerning the new schoolhouse bond issue. However, there is one point that was not touched upon, and as there has been considerable made of it this week we give room here to a statement from Mr. E. F. Day, from whom the Directors now have an option for the piece of land on the flat where it is proposed to locate the new building. Mr. Day's statement is clear and needs no comment from this paper. It follows:

Heppner, Ore., June 27, 1912.
 To the District School Board of School District No. 1, Morrow County, Oregon: Gentleman:

I am informed that statements are being circulated to the effect that I have offered to sell the property now offered to the District as a school site, to private individuals for a sum considerable less than the price now made to the District.

Some twenty or more years ago, when a site was being selected for the old school building I was willing to sell this property to the District for \$1200.00. I considered this much less than the value of the property, but was anxious at that time to see the old building located on this site. Since then I have held the property at \$250.00 per lot or \$2250.00, for the eleven lots, but still believing this is the proper location for Heppner's School buildings I made a price to the Board of \$1800.00, for the two blocks, containing eleven lots.

Any and all statements to the effect that I have offered the property for a less figure than above stated in the last fifteen years are absolutely false and manufactured out of whole cloth by individuals seeking to defeat the construction of a new school building in Heppner.
