SCHOOL NOTES.

A few days ago, the writer had the pleasure of visiting the high school at Arlington. The high school has outgrown its quarters, and an additional room has been fitted up in the Masonic building and another teacher added to the teaching force. Prof. Mulkey and his assistants are making every effort to place the school at the top so far as efficiency is concerned. There is a movement on foot to build a new school building. The old building is wholly inadequate. A new building in keeping with the progressive spirit of the town would be a good investment.
The writer also visited the Crook County high school at Prineville. Here a large army of intelligent and energetic students. The main building is a substantial brick and concrete structure. In this work of the high school courses is carried on. In the annex which is the old court house, the commercial and agricultural departments are located. The commercial department is well equipped with suitable furniture for the theory work and with an excellent line of offices for actual business practice. The typewriting room is provided with a half dozen typewriters. The commercial course is very popular. The work in agriculture is made practical and is growing in popularity. A new building has just been completed for the manual training and domestic science work. It is of the bungalow type and occupies one corner of the campus. Supt. Baughman has the work of the entire school well organized. Crook County may well be proud of its high school.
County Superintendent Myers was not over-looked. He is a live school man, and the writer passed a very profitable and enjoyable hour with him, talking over the school work as seen from the standpoint of a county superintendent.
On the trip to Prineville, nothing impressed one more than the Dearborn river. While glowing accounts of the power possibilities of this stream have been published from time to time, it must be seen to be appreciated. The amount of unused power in this river can scarcely be measured. Some day it will turn millions of wheels. A trip into this great interior country is worth one's while.
Harry Zerang, mail clerk on the Heppner branch of the O. W. R. & N. Co., for the last five years, has been removed to the Portland-Corvallis run. He will move his family to Portland where they will reside permanently. Mr. and Mrs. Zerang were both active workers in church circles in Heppner. Their departure is very much regretted by their many friends.
Neils M. Johnson, prosperous farmer of Gooseberry, was a visitor at Heppner over Tuesday, and attended the initiatory services of Doris Lodge No. 20, E. of P. Mr. Johnson states that his section of country looks mighty fine at present, all fall sowing is done and the grain is coming up fine.
