Eric W. Allen Will Invite Journalism Teachers to Oregon in 1915.

University of Oregon, Eugene, Nov. 25.—Eric W. Allen, head of the department of journalism of the University of Oregon, will invite the national convention of teachers of journalism to hold its 1915 session in Oregon. Mr. Allen left Saturday for Madison, Wis., where this year's convention will begin tomorrow (Nov. 26.) From Madison he will go to New York to spend a few days observing the plant and teaching methods of the newly opened million dollar Pulitzer school of journalism. Next to the Pulitzer school, the schools of the University of Wisconsin and the University of Missouri rank in size. The University of Wisconsin is at Madison and Mr. Allen will probably visit the University of Missouri school at Columbia, in quest of ideas. The University of Oregon is believed to have the fourth largest department of journalism.

The representation will be made to the teachers from the 36 departments so far established that by coming to Oregon for the 1915 session they will be within easy reach of the Panama Fair.

LIVE STOCK SHOW TO BE OF UNUSUAL SCOPE

Portland, Ore. Nov. 25 (Special).—From all over the West, and from some of the Middle Western states come reports of intending exhibitors to the International Livestock Exposition to be held at the Portland Union Stockyards, December 8-13. Guernseys from Wisconsin, Holsteins from Arizona, Herefords and Shorthorns from Montana will be seen on dress parade by the side of fancy livestock from the agricultural colleges of California, Idaho, Washington and Oregon. Stump's herd of Jerseys from Monmouth, Oregon from which the grand champion heifer for the United States at the National show in Chicago was taken, will be entered, and the Brown, Minor and Dunn Shorthorns are also on this circuit. Many entries of sheep from the most prominent flocks of the Northwest will also be shown.

The exposition officials have been fortunate in securing the services of some of the most famous livestock judges in the Union to take care of the classes. Practically all the men selected have been judges at the International Livestock Exposition or the National Dairy Show at Chicago and all are noted for exceptional ability and fairness. Commercial and booster clubs all over the Northwest are enthusiastically stirring up interest in the event, full special car parties are promised from a number of the cities of Eastern and Central Oregon and it is expected that many people all over the country will take advantage of the reduced railroad rates.
