

SCHOOL NOTES.

By Supt. Notson. In District No. 16 I found Miss Lillian Troedson and ten pupils at work. This school has a good dictionary and a fine lot of library books. The windows are provided with window boards. The light is admitted from the left side. While the school is small, nearly all grades are represented and it keeps the teacher busy to take care of the classes.

Miss Elva Troedson teaches in District No. 14. Ten pupils were present. A bank of earth has been thrown up against the foundation, which keeps the wind from blowing under the building. A new outbuilding has been built recently. In this school, nearly all grades are represented.

In Joint-District No. 52, Mrs. Frances Allard is the teacher. There is a good globe, and some new maps and an International dictionary have been ordered. The monthly examinations had just been held and the results were very satisfactory.

Miss Grace May teaches in District No. 5. There is a globe and good set of maps. Window boards are provided for all the windows. A small nail of water is kept on the stove to provide moisture for the atmosphere of the room. The water supply is kept in a close jar. The flag was displayed over the building. A good sand-table is part of the equipment, having been constructed by the teacher herself. Phonics receive much attention. The number of classes is so great that it is impossible to give to each the time it should have. However the pupils are doing good work.

In District No. 8, Miss Ida Olson is at the helm. This school has a good dictionary. There are good window boards, a closed tank for the water supply, a jacket for the stove, and two fans. A can of water is kept on the stove. The foundation needs some repairing and I understand that it will be repaired soon so as to shut the wind out from under the floor.

On the evening of the 12th inst. I had the pleasure of attending a meeting of the parent-teacher association at Lexington. There was a goodly number in attendance. The association is doing a good work. An effort is being made to secure the assistance of some able lecturers from the State University and elsewhere.
