The case of the State of Oregon against Mack Smith, came to trial before Judge Phelps in the Circuit Court on Tuesday afternoon. Mr. Smith had been indicted on the charge of neglect of duty while in the office of marshal of the City of Heppner. In the trial it appeared that he had knowledge of the violation of law and failed to furnish this knowledge to the district attorney; in other words he was accused of protecting and permitting gambling within the city over which he presided as a peace officer. Smith was defended by S. E. Van Vactor and Glenn Y. Wells prosecuted. After being out until a late hour on Tuesday night the jury finally agreed on a verdict of guilty and so reported. The judgment of the court was passed on Mr. Smith yesterday afternoon, and he was sentenced to pay a fine of \$500, or to serve a day for each \$2.00 thereof in the county jail.
