

Notice Of Estimated Expenses And Proposed Tax Levy For Morrow County, Oregon, For The Year 1915.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on Thursday the 3rd day of December, 1914, the County Court of Morrow County, Oregon, will be in regular session at the Court House in Heppner, Oregon, and any taxpayer of Morrow County, Oregon, will be heard in favor of or against the proposed tax levy as hereinafter proposed.

ITEMIZED STATEMENT.

Prepared in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 234 of the 1913 Oregon Session Laws, showing an estimate of the amount of money required to be raised by taxation by Morrow County, Oregon, for the year 1915, to maintain each department of the county government, county officer or officer, and for each county improvement, the maintenance of each county building, structure or institution, and for the salary of each county officer, or employee, and for the improvement and maintenance of public highways, roads and bridges, and for other contemplated expenditures.

Also showing the probable receipts of Morrow County, Oregon, from sources other than direct taxation upon real and personal property for the year 1915, and also the amount of the balances of the various funds of Morrow County, Oregon, on Nov. 1, 1914.
