Pendleton is planning for a new school.

Silverton sawmill has resumed operations.

Rex is moving for a new high school building.

Ashland adds \$100,000 auxiliary to water system.

Gold Hill is planning a street improvement campaign.

A promoter of gas plants has Corvallis on his list.

Hubbard Enterprise is fighting for a new high school.

Cutting out one judge reduces the expenses of elections.

Eugene has a broom factory and wants broom-makers.

The Dallas Mercantile Co. will add 40 feet to their store.

The Pendleton hotel is to have a two story concrete annex.

The Pioneer Creamery at Prineville will resume operations.

Welch & Co., Baker undertakers, will erect an \$8000 building.

The Tudor Arms apartment at Portland is to cost \$125,000.

The Fisher block is to be built at a cost of \$9000 at Beaverton.

Redmond wants a starch factory and reports several gold strikes.

The Poulson Logging Camp at Inman has resumed operations, employing 200 men.

The Shell Gasoline Co. of California will install a \$500,000 storage system at Portland.

H. O. Fry and John Volz have added new machines to Marshfield broom handle plant.

Paying two to three millions income and war tax is not helping make Oregon prosperous.

Women have been receiving \$22.00 a month less for teaching than men. A law just enacted aims to give the same.

The Interstate Commerce Commission rules the S. P. Co. can continue to operate the Pacific Mail Steamship Company.

Three state development bills were passed by the House—to lease the soda lakes, to grant right of way over public lands and to sell citizens state annuities.
