Portland, May 18 .- That the dairynen of the Willamette Valley are fulphenominal success of the auction sale of registered and grade Jerseys Oregon. at Independence last week. The total number of animals changing hands was 185, of which 135 were registered merit cattle. This is the largest number of Jerseys of this class ever offered at one sale in the United States. Congressman McArthur was one of the largest buyers, securing ten animals at a total cost of \$2,590, his highest price being \$375. Other high bids were: H. H. Curtis, \$500; W. L. Pate, \$400 and W. B. Allen, \$395. As many as 36 head of Jerseys were brought to this sale by a single breeder.

Prof. Thos. Shaw, the noted agriculturist of the Great Northern system, accompanied by a party of high officials of the Hill lines, will make a tour of Central and Eastern Oregon during the week beginning May 31. This will be an educational trip, the experts in the party giving lectures and demonstrations at all principal points in the territory visited. They will study the Tumalo project and other irrigated and dry-farming sections and on their return will make examples of the property of the benefit of the content of th

Governor Withycombe has designated September 21, 22 and 23 as the dates for the waterpower and public land conference of Western states which will be held in Portland. At its late session the Legislature provided for such conference and authorized the Governor to fix the dates. The Oregon delegation will be: E. B. Piper, of the Oregonian; W. Lair Thompson, president of the senate; S. B. Huston and S. C. Hudson, of Bend. The Governor will act as chairman of the delegation.

At the convention of the Columbia Snake River Waterways associaflon at Astoria last week, W. W. Har-ragh, of Pendleton, said: "If the open river causes a reduction of but two cents per bushel on wheat, it will save Umatilia county alone \$120,000 per year, and if corresponding reductions are made on other commodities shipped from that county, it will

All preliminaries having been set-tled, work of clearing the right of way for the California & Oregon Coast Railway, from Grants Pass to Crescent City, Cal., will be started at once. The contract provides that the line shall be completed to Hays Hill within six months and that the first 40 miles shall be finished in 40 months. This line will open up the rich copper region of the Illinois River and the timber country below

As an echo of the recent opening of he canal at Oregon City for the free mssage of river craft, it is announced that a line of boats to carry passen-ers and freight will be put on be-ween Portland, Dayton and McMinn-ville, on the Yamhill River. A small lob of dredging will make that river easily navigable for light draft

In an effort to stimulate the use of Oregon manufactured goods and Ore-con labor, the Chamber of Commerce Portland yesterday began a camalgn through its bureau of indus ries and manufactures to take adantage of the Bingham bill which ecomes ecective as a law this month and which was passed at the last egislative session.

The Bingham bill gives a preferential of five per cent in favor of goods canufactured in Oregon, or in tavor of Oregon labor, in the consideration of competitive bidding before county courts, beards of county counties to the county counties to the counties of the c aissioners, school boards city counils, or other public officers authorzed to purchase supplies or contract

or labor. 'In plainer English, a purchasing officer is authorized to accept as the owest bid for labor or supplies that re offered by representatives of Ore-con products, if the bid of the latter not more than five per cent higher than the lowest bidder from any other state, said Geo. D. Lee, secre-ary of the bureau. "It is intended o counterbalance the difference in he cost of production, as between lo-al and foreign concerns. It some-chat adds to the handleap of the forign manufacturer represented by reight rates, and it should prove an ncouragement to the establishment of factories for the manufacture of hose items needed in the building of oads and bridges and materials conumed by municipal purchase.

"Senator Bingham introduced the oill after consultation with represenatives of the organizations which have been struggling to enlarge the market for those factories already here and to pave the way for others

yet to be secured.
