The oats, of which Mr. Matlock has 70 acres, is 5 feet 4 inches high, and well headed. The wheat is 4 ft. 2 inches high and stands very even in a field of 40 acres, and will no doubt make a large yield as the heads are large and well filled.

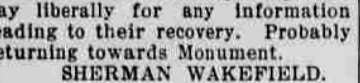
