NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on Thursday the 2nd day of December, 1915, the County Court of Morrow County, Oregon, will be in regular session at the Court House in Heppner, Oregon, and any taxpayer of Morrow County, Oregon, will be heard in favor or against the proposed tax levy as hereinafter proposed.
