

Lincoln and the Man on Horseback.

Early references that John Hay made in his diary to General McClellan, says Mr. Thayer in his biography of Lincoln's private secretary, prepared for McClellan's failure. The entry for November 13, 1862, reads: "I wish here to record what I consider a portent of evil to come. The President, Governor Seward and I went over to McClellan's home tonight. The servant at the door said the general was at the wedding of Colonel Wheaton at General Buell's, and would return shortly. We went in, and after we had waited about an hour, McClellan came in, and without paying any particular attention to the porter who told him the President was waiting to see him, went upstairs passing the door of the room where the President and Secretary of State were seated. They waited half an hour, and sent once more a servant to tell the general they were there; and the answer came that the general had gone to bed.

I merely record this unparalleled insouciance of epaulets without comment. It is the first indication I have yet seen of the threatened supremacy of the military authorities. Coming home I spoke to the President about the matter, but he seemed not to have noticed it specially, saying it were better at this time not to be making points of etiquette and personal dignity.

To Win in Modern War Calls for a Maximum Organization of Industry Says Professor Stafford of State U.

University of Oregon, Eugene, Apr. 24.—A meeting of the recently-appointed Oregon committee of the naval consulting board, of which George C. Mason of Portland is chairman and O. F. Stafford, professor of chemistry in the State University, is a member, will probably be held in Portland this week. At the meeting a survey of the state's "war resources" will probably be arranged for. A state's war resources are the things it can turn out, preferably at short notice, for military use.

A survey of war resources would call for an inventory of establishments that do now, or could in emergency, make guns, ammunition, army equipment such as blankets, food supplies, transportation material, and other essentials.

The plan of the naval consulting board of the United States, of which Thomas A. Edison is chairman, is first to arouse the whole country to the need of making industry the basic line of defense, on the theory that the nation is likely to win which can supply most munitions at greatest speed to the men at the front.

"Maximum organization of industry is accordingly necessary for success," said Professor Stafford. "The national committee is undertaking an inventory of 30,000 firms."
