Astoria's Chinatown being rebuilt. Roseburg may get a large fruit packing plant.

Gresham's main street to be paved with bitulithic.

Donald co-operative cheese factory increasing out put.

Silver Lake—Railroad to Klamath Falls being surveyed.

Salem—Mile of paving to go down on S. Commercial St.

Portland has \$500,000 street improvement under way.

Astoria dairymen have advanced prices of milk and cream.

Milton's new Carnegie Library to cost \$9500—work started.

Astoria Flouring Mills Co. will build warehouse 80 by 120.

Paisley—Bond election carries 3 to 1 for \$30,000 high school.

Sheridan rebuilding cannery and installing fruit juice factory.

Joseph—McCully Mercantile Co. to erect concrete store building.

Vale—American Nitrate Co. has 45 men at work in Lake county.

Roseburg—Contract let for construction of an amusement park.

Willow Creek—Community Irrigation district of 10,000 organized.

Port Orford wharf to be reconstructed by S. F. lumber company.

Oregon City—Several new school buildings to go up costing \$15,000.

Lumber mills of northwest restrict out put lay off one day in the week.

Coquille—67.2 pounds of butter fat is record for one cow in month of May.

Florence—Survey reports Siuslaw bar show 16 feet of water at low tide.

Marshfield—Reported \$5 lbs. black sand produced \$17 platinum and \$2.50 gold.

Baker—Muddy Creek district voted \$15,000 to build new school at once.

Marshfield—500 sawmill men idle on Coos Bay owing to longshoremen strike.

Pilot Rock—200,000 lbs. of wool sold here at 21¼ to 31½ cts. per pound.

St. Helens—John Phillips has contract to get out 100,000 paving blocks.

Grants Pass—Takilma smelter not used since 1908 to be put in commission.

Marshfield—Menasha Wooden Ware Co. of Chicago interested in plant here.

Marshfield—Experiments conducted here show black sand rich in platinum and gold.

Eugene—Careful survey of flax crop by State University shows profit of \$36.50 per acre.

Eugene company to manufacture hand made sport and outing shoes for men and women.

Roseburg Brewing & Ice Co. reorganize to operate soft drink and cold storage plant.

Salem—In reconstructing penitentiary buildings, all Oregon building material will be used.

Springfield—S. P. Co. puts on special train to handle increased log output from Mohawk Valley.

Cresswell—Jury found for defendant S. P. Co. in damage suit for train killing children where man deliberately drove on track.

"Vocational education" seems to prepare nine out of ten for some state or federal salaried position. The country needs more producers.

Chemawa—Government Indian school will expend \$12,500 on enlarging auditorium, \$5,000 on new sewers and \$12,000 on new building.

Roseburg—Agreement reached between city and Pittsburg holders of large timberland on North Umpqua. Under terms of agreement, Kendall Brothers will lease the rail road for a term of 30 years. Sawmill will be erected as soon as actual work is begun on railroad. Mill will have capacity of 250,000 feet of finished lumber daily.

The increase of population from 1900 to 1910 shows Portland 116,783 and all other towns and cities 96,372. Rural Sections 46,069. Thus is shown that the rush of people is anywhere except back to the farm, 18 per cent to the country, 45 per cent to Portland and 37 per cent to other urban communities.—Malheur Enterprise.

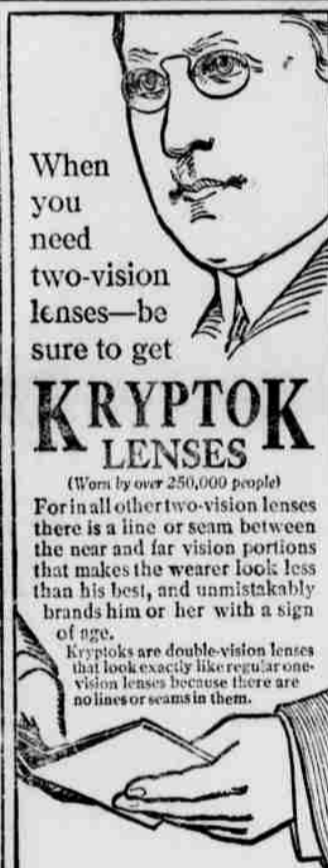
The marshal found it necessary to arrest but one person on celebration day, which speaks volumes of praise for the big crowd assembled.

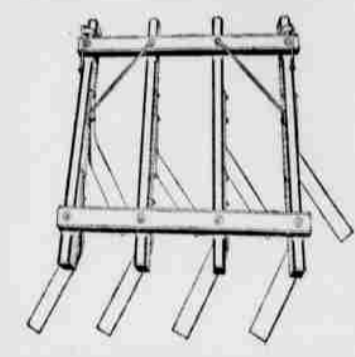

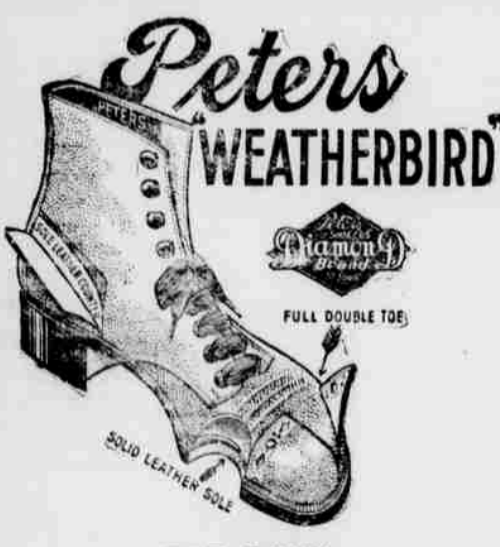
