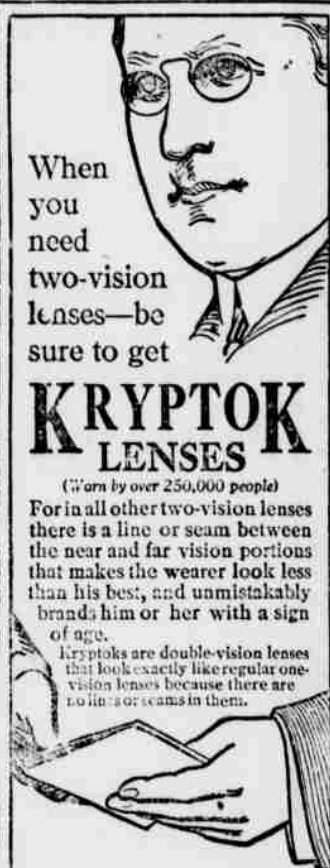
Mrs. Elita Fryear and Miss Meta

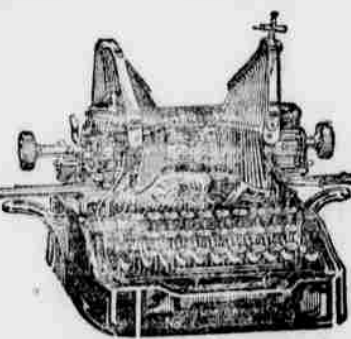
