CLEANING PLANT DOES FINE WORK SAY EXPERTS

Pendleton's latest industry, the H. W. Collins wheat cleaning plant and elevator on West Webb street, has started the work of cleaning a large share of the wheat of eastern Oregon and southern Washington. The plant is running days now and shortly will be operated day and night with two full crews of men. Fifteen men are employed at the plant at present.

The work of the plant is pronounced to be perfect by experts who have viewed it. Wheat in a very smutty condition is turned out of the machine white and clean and ready for the mill without additional scouring of washing. The plant has a capacity of cleaning and smutting between 400 and 500 tons of wheat daily.

As to how much wheat will be taken care of by the Collins cleaner it is impossible to estimate. Should the European war be brought to a close and wheat sent to the Pacific coast points again the plant would be of little use except for local purposes.

The cleaner and elevator is the largest in eastern Oregon and the interior.—Pendleton E. O.
