Among their edibles was a tub of butter. During the night the animals roaming about the camp rolled the tub with its contents into the creek. The stream was

It seems they were aiding the wagons of the commissary which got ahead of the army. Two wagons camped on the creek over-night. The men had only sugar and butter to eat until the other wagons caugh up with them.
