EASTERN OREGON SHEEP ARE IN QUARANTINE

Oregon State Live Stock Sanitary Board Constituting Ex Officio The State Board of Sheep Commissioners.

We have been handed the following resolution by W. B. Barratt president of the Oregon Woolgrowers' Association regarding sheep scabies in Morrow County.

Salem, Oregon, Jan., 25, 1917.

WHEREAS, Sheep scabies is actually in existence in certain districts lying west of the Cascade Mountains in Oregon; and,

WHEREAS, Certain of these sheep have been allowed to be moved to Eastern Oregon; and,

WHEREAS, The infection of scabies has been transmitted to other flocks;

NOW, THEREFORE, We, the State Live Stock Sanitary Board constituting ex officio the Board of Sheep Commissioners, acting upon the recommendations of the State Veterinarian, he being ex officio State Sheep Inspector, do hereby declare and proclaim a quarantine against the movement of any sheep in Western Oregon to points in Eastern Oregon and other states, except and unless said sheep have been inspected and certified to on the farm as being free from sheep scabies and exposure thereto by the State Veterinarian, he being ex officio State Sheep Inspector, or his duties; or, in lieu of this inspection, that these sheep be dipped twice under the supervision of the proper officer and in the manner prescribed by the State Stock Sanitary Board, constituting ex officio the Board of Sheep Commissioners.

PROVIDED, That sheep that are shipped from the Union Stock Yards, Portland, Oregon, and other public stock yards, whether covered by certificate showing inspection on the farm or not, be required to be dipped twice before being shipped to points in Eastern Oregon and other States.

PROVIDED, FURTHER, That all cars in which inspected and declared free sheep or dipped sheep are to be moved in for purposes other than immediate slaughter are to be first cleaned and disinfected under the supervision of the proper disinfecting officer.

All common carriers engaged in the transportation of such shipments are hereby notified of this proclamation.

In the recruiting district of Oregon during the month of January there were 126 men enlisted in the Regular Army, which is very encouraging as it is considerably more than the monthly quota fixed by the War Department for this State. Another very encouraging feature about this is, that a goodly number of these men were accepted by postmasters throughout the State. There are in the United States 55,000 available postmaster recruiting agents, and it is thought by the War Department officials that the recruiting problem will be solved whenever there are three or four active postmaster recruiting agents in each county, which is the recruiting unit.

MANY CARS EXHIBITED AT AUTOMOBILE SHOW

K. L. Beach of Beach & Allyn, local dealers for the Reo and Dort cars has just returned from the Eighth Annual Automobile Show which was held at Portland last week. It has been conceded by all who attended the show that this is the largest and most successful Automobile Show ever held in the Northwest.

Decorated to represent the great Columbia Highway with a canopy of blue and white and beautifully painted scenes along the walls, the Armory was a fitting background for the display of motor cars. Automobiles of every known make and design were shown to crowds of enthusiastic spectators who thronged the building both afternoons and evenings.

At the booth of the Northwest Auto Company, distributors for the Northwest and the home of the Marmon, Cole, Reo, and Dort pleasure cars, as well as the Reo, Stewart and Indiana trucks, could be seen especially designed models of each make of car—fourteen in all. In truth, it was a magnificent display.

It is interesting to note that the Dort factory considered the Portland Automobile Show of sufficient importance to send two of their representatives there with a specially made cut-out chassis, painted white and gray and showing all working parts to splendid advantage.

Messrs. Jas. Robertson and W. M. Buch, Service Engineer of the Dort Motor Car Company, each afternoon and evening delivered very interesting lectures explaining the peculiar features of the Dort. These lectures were listened to by crowds who gathered about the chassis and were a source of education to many.

They spoke in part as follows: "Every permanent organization must have a foundation which, in motor cars, is the frame. The Dort frame is made of finest grade, heavy pressed steel, re-inforced by pressed steel cross members, with angle plates hot rivetted at all corners, preventing all possibility of the frame becoming twisted under the most severe usage.
